## **1996 LSPNG & SPCM Conference**

The conference was held at the Coastwatcher's Hotel in Madang on June 13 & 14. There was no set theme for the conference; papers were presented on the following topics:

- The comparative study of Eastern Highlands languages
- Active/middle voice systems in Motuna
- Preliminary study on Engan reverse language
- Switch reference and control in Apali
- A syntactic feature of PNG English
- More on Arapesh noun clauses
- Serial clauses in Olo
- Medial verbs in Gahuku

## **1996 Annual General Meeting**

The 1996 AGM was held on June 14 in conjunction with the conference. Full minutes of the conference are available from the secretary/treasurer upon request. The members of the executive for 1996-7 are: President -- Dicks Thomas (UPNG), President-elect -- Otto Nekitel (UPNG), Secretary/treasurer -- Carl Whitehead (SIL-PNG), LLM editor -- Kevin Ford (UPNG), Review editor -- Ana Kila (Unitech), Members-at-large -- Philip Tama (UPNG) & Liisa Järvinen (SIL-PNG).

Motions were passed to (i) extend the term of office for the President from one year to two in order to provide better continuity, and (ii) to instruct the President and Secretary/treasurer to "pursue constitutional methods of reducing the executive committee to consist of only the President, Secretary/treasurer and LLM editor."

The meeting also approved an executive committee proposal to establish a trust fund of K10,000 with the interest to be used annually for scholarships or grants. Gifts received from the membership for scholarships would be added to the interest amount. In years when no scholarship applications are received, the money for that year "MAY be given as a grant to an established government or NGO research organisation working on Melanesian soil." (No applications had been received so no scholarship funds were dispersed at this meeting.)

Finally, the membership fees for the society were adjusted to PNGK 15, Aus\$ 20 and US\$ 20 per year. This will result in all members contributing approximately the same amount to general expenses once bank charges and postage rates have been deducted. These rates will take effect beginning in 1997.

## **LLM schedule**

Both issues of volume 26 (for 1995) were mailed out in February this year so you should have received both by now. Due to changes in personnel and computer programmes being used, volume 27 is delayed. The first issue is now in the hands of the layout personnel and should be

going to print in December. The second issue should not be far behind. Submissions for inclusion in subsequent volumes should be sent to LLM Editor (K Ford), UPNG Box 320, University PO, PNG.
