## LLM Status report

Volume 27:1 (1996) was published and distributed in June 1997. Volume 27:2 is currently in press and should be in the mail by the end of January. However, the editor has still not received sufficient papers to compile volume 28 (1997). He has proposed that volumes 28 and 29 be combined into a single volume which will hopefully be published later this year. If this proves to be necessary, the executive may decide to charge for only one year's membership/subscription fee for the two year period.
